

Wild Waters 2021 Packing List

Please bring what you need but nothing extra, space is a premium in our vehicles.

Please use a soft sided duffle bag for traveling, (no rolling bags), all luggage for 7 people must fit in the back of the van, all 7 seats will be taken with people.



- Face masks (recommend at least 3)
- Sack dinner for departure day
- Money for souvenirs and snacks
- Mess kit with plate, bowl & silverware. We will not have paper or plastic ware for meals. Sustainable practices will reduce our waste.
- Hard Container for sandwiches that fits in a backpack.
 - Similar to this [mess kit](#) (which contains sandwich container, plate, bowl, and silverware) or purchase individually.
- Travel mug if you wish to purchase hot chocolate or coffee from the camp store
- **2-3 1 LITER WATER BOTTLES** or a 3L water reservoir.
- Sunglasses
- Layers for all weather types (Average high and low temp in June are 61°F and 36°F)
- Coat
- Heavy layer, sweatshirt, hoodie, or fleece
- Light layer (shirts you can layer - t-shirts/long sleeve shirts)
- Rain gear (waterproof)
- Pants and shorts for hiking
- Day Backpack- no string backpack. 18L is a good size
- Ball cap or wide brim hat
- Winter hat
- Sunscreen
- Chapstick
- Insect repellent
- Gloves
- Warm socks (wool pair recommended)
- Undergarments
- Pajamas
- Camera (cell phone is okay)

- A cell phone charging block or solar charger (optional) - There is no electricity in the cabins.
- Binoculars (optional)
- Flashlight/headlamp
- Sturdy shoes
- Hiking boots (optional)
- All toiletries:
 - Toothbrush
 - Toothpaste
 - Deodorant
 - Shampoo
 - Conditioner
 - Soap
 - Towel
 - Washcloth
 - Flip flops for shower
- Water shoes
- Swimsuit (optional for swimming & canoeing at Jackson Lake)
- Pillow
- Sleeping bag
- Blanket
- Journal, sketchbook, book, or cards
- Mini campfire chair like [this](#) (optional)
- Personal snacks
- Wyoming Fishing Licence (optional). Fishing will be an optional activity on this trip. Students under the age of 14 **DO NOT** need to purchase a fishing licence or conservation stamp they will be able to participate with an adult/chaperone that does possess a licence. If students over the age of 14 and wish to fish during the trip, they will need to purchase a fishing licence. Here is a [step by step guide](#) on how to do so. I would recommend purchasing the "Youth Annual Licence" instead of the daily tag since fishing can be weather dependent.
