**The KIC committee has updated the Purple and Gold Card Criteria. The
updated KIC information sheet is below.**

PURPLE AND GOLD STICKERS

- **Gold card students will have to have at least FOUR 4s in conduct and effort to receive a gold label.**
- **Students with a 1 or 2 for conduct and effort will not be on the KIC list.**

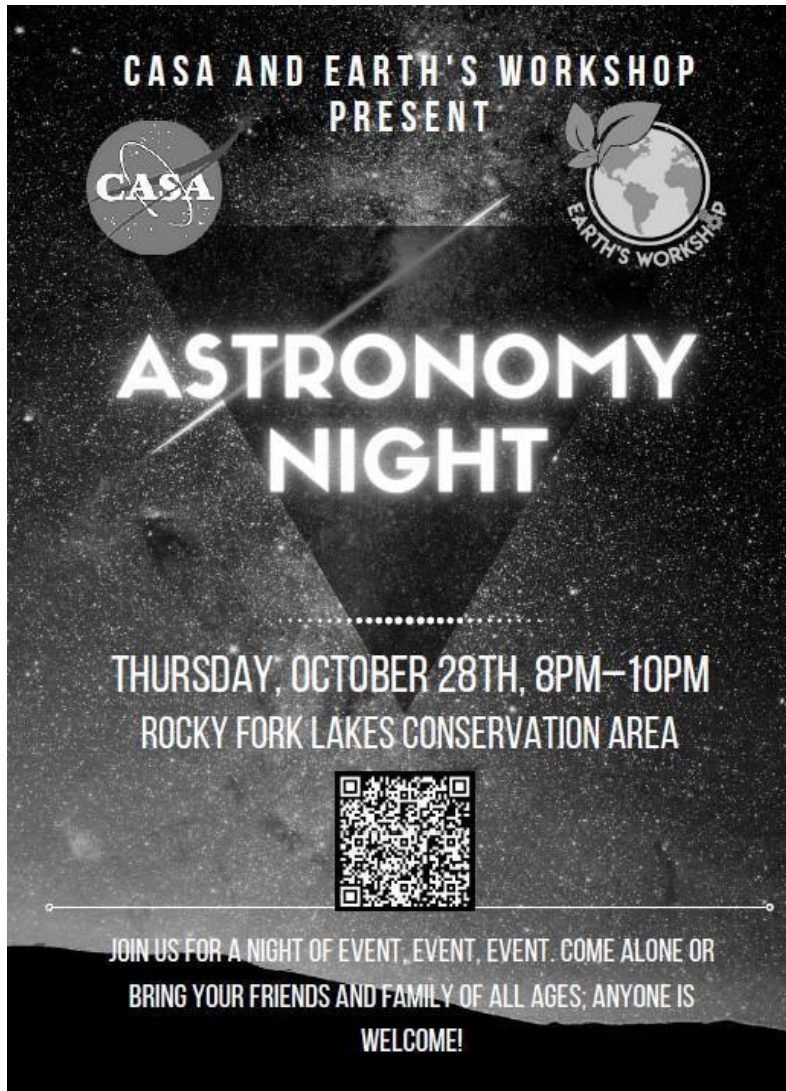


