## MAP Fact Sheet for Students Eligible for Free or Reduced-price Lunch Comparisons for 2015 to 2016

### English Language Arts

#### Proficient and Advanced

Grade	Cohort % Change
4	4.3%
5	7.5%
7	2.1%
8	3.1%

- Proficient and Advanced increased 4.9 percentage points for all of CPS
- When looking at cohorts (e.g., 7<sup>th</sup> grade 2015 and 8<sup>th</sup> grade 2016), 4 of 5 grade levels increased the percentage of kids in the proficient range

#### Below Basic

Grade	Cohort % Change
4	5.1% improvement
5	13.9% improvement

- The percentage of students in Below Basic reduced overall by 2.2%
- Lower grade level cohorts experienced fewer students in the Below Basic range
- Improvement means a decrease of students in Below Basic

### Math

#### Proficient and Advanced

Grade	Cohort % Change
4	3.7%
7	4.4%

- Proficient and Advanced increased 3.8 percentage points for all of CPS
- When looking at cohorts (e.g., 7<sup>th</sup> grade 2015 and 8<sup>th</sup> grade 2016), 2 of 5 grade levels increased the percentage of kids in the proficient range

#### Below Basic

Grade	Cohort % Change
4	8.4% improvement
6	4.9% improvement
7	11.0% improvement
8	1.7% improvement

- The percentage of students in Below Basic reduced overall by 7.6%
- Cohort changes in math were mixed with 4<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, and 8<sup>th</sup> grade cohorts showing fewer students in Below Basic
- Improvement means a decrease of students in Below Basic
