WHAT DOES EEE CLASS LOOK LIKE?





GRADES



Parents and students are strongly encouraged to check the **Home Access Portal** on a weekly basis to view the most current grades for EVERY class.

EEE is graded on a Pass/Fail system, with points assigned for a variety of skills. Feedback is given in relation to a proficiency scale and/or rubric. Areas assessed include:

- Independence
- Initiative
- Perseverance
- Problem solving
- Responsibility/Effort
- Flexibility/Mindset
- Work completion/quality
- Interactions with peers
- Interactions with adults

LATE / INCOMPLETE WORK

Revisions are welcomed! Students are able to revise all graded assignments in order to show their best work, as that is a hallmark of improvement. Work may be completed at home or in class. Students and parents should check Home Access frequently to ensure all work is turned in. If an assignment is missing, Home Access will reflect that with an NHI (not handed in) until a quality product is turned in, graded, and scores are entered.

**DON'T PANIC****HOMEWORK**

Most assignments given during the school year are designed with enough class time to complete a EEE quality final project assuming hard work, few distractions, good effort, and motivation. However, there may be times when students should bring a task home in order to complete it or revise it for quality. Pacing matters! Assignments not on pace to be ready to turn in on the due date will be the student's responsibility to complete for homework.

TECHNOLOGY

Students are assigned a district iPad to use during class time and for homework. All time spent on personal devices should be kept to a minimum and only used when necessary with permission from a teacher. Most assignments in EEE are digital, so having a fully charged iPad each night is a requirement. We most likely will not have charging stations again this year due to COVID restrictions, so be sure to also bring your charger or a power bank if needed. Be sure to bring earbuds to class each day. GRADING PROCEDURES

Students will be given a variety of assignments ranging from daily activities to long-term projects. Examples include: group and individual projects, tests, quizzes, and class work activities. Feedback is given verbally through conferences and in written form. Proficiency scales are used often to assess where a student is currently working within a standard. Points are given on completed work. All assignments are considered works-in-progress and are open to revisions until the student is satisfied that it displays his/her best EEE quality work, or until a hard deadline approaches.
