Teachers continue to receive professional development in setting learning targets, developing success criteria and utilizing state standards and proficiency scales for grading. The NEE is also currently being used to evaluate teachers and set improvement goals. This instrument has clear indicators that allow teachers to understand exactly how to improve instruction. Teachers also participated in professional development in our new Benchmark plus materials, Fundations, Equity, Restorative Practice, and Behavior Team. Our title I reading teachers pulls students out of classrooms in small groups to provide intervention support for classroom teachers.

Describe activities

Each spring there are numerous events where preschool parents are introduced to elementary school, both at the preschool site and at the elementary. Also, there are transition meetings with preschool and the home schools to make sure critical information about the student is passed on to the new school. Preschool teachers for the most at risk students are at the home elementary on the first day of school to help with the transition and to assist with parent questions since relationships are stronger with the preschool teacher than the new elementary.
